

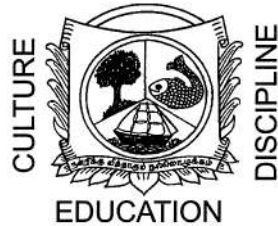

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THE COLLEGE CREST AND MOTTO



A shield with a circle divided into three sectors depicting a neem tree (Azadirachta Indica Linn.) on the left, a fish on the right and a sailing ship at the bottom. Three symbols speak the glory of the ancient Pandian Kingdom - the neem being the national, the fish being the insignia on the Pandian flag and the sailing ship symbolising the mercantile maritime glory of ancient Tamilnadu.

The motto inscribed on the scroll placed at the base of the shield is taken from Thirukkural and signifies that good conduct is the seed of all virtues.

The shield and the scroll rest on a lotus blossom.

HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Gratefully accepting the generous offer of two lakh rupees made by Rao Bahadur **M.S.P. Senthikumara Nadar**, the leading members of the merchant community of Virudhunagar founded the college in 1947 with a view to bringing the benefits of higher education to the youths of this region. From 1947 to 1951 the college was housed in the spacious ground and the bungalow of the Madura Mills adjacent to the Railway Station. At the end of the first year, the Hindu Nadars of Virudhunagar decided to shoulder the responsibility of running the college. In June 1951, the college was shifted to the present permanent precincts on the Aruppukotai Road. Since then the buildings for the college and hostels have been coming up in rapid succession. The College which began its life in thatched tenements with about a hundred students and eleven teachers has grown at a rapid rate into a premier college with magnificent buildings and spacious grounds, with more than 3900 students and 200 teachers. The institution has attained an eminent status with 13 UG and 7 PG programmes in regular stream and 7 UG and 8 PG programmes in self-finance stream. Above all it offers Ph.D. programmes in English, Chemistry, Botany, Commerce, Physics, Mathematics, Zoology, Microbiology, Computer Science and Business Administration. It also functions in the evenings by offering 6 Certificate courses, 5 Diploma courses, 5 Advanced Diploma courses and 1 P.G. Diploma course. The institution also offers UGC sponsored B.Voc. courses on Environmental Assessment and Remediation and Food Safety and Quality Management. The UGC granted autonomous status to the institution in 2012. The college is accredited with 'A' Grade by NAAC in the fourth cycle of accreditation. To add one more feather to its cap, in the year 2019 - 2020 the institution has secured 53rd rank in the National Institutional Ranking Framework by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, New Delhi.

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4. Soon after being admitted, the student should get the identity card with his/her photo, duly signed, to enable him/her to enter the college, library, laboratory, hostels etc. If the identity card is lost, the student should report the loss immediately to the Principal and obtain a duplicate on payment.
5. A student who leaves the institution in the middle of a semester should apply for withdrawal from the institution in the prescribed form He/ She cannot claim refund of fees for the rest of the year, as a matter of right.
6. If any student is expelled from the college, intimation of the fact will be given by the Principal to the Parent or Guardian and the Transfer Certificate will be sent to the University.
7. The name of the student will be removed from the college if he/she is irregular in attendance or he/she fails in all the subjects for which he/she has appeared.
8. Student shall obtain the following certificates by submitting prescribed application forms:
 - a) Transfer Certificate
 - b) Conduct Certificate
 - c) Course Certificate
 - d) Date of Birth Certificate
 - e) Attendance Certificate

Duplicate transfer certificate and conduct certificate shall not be issued unless a student shall come in person and apply to the Principal along with a certificate from the Tahsildar with true reason for the loss of the above certificate and giving declaration in writing that the originals were lost beyond recovery.

PAYMENT OF FEES

All UG students belonging to all community and PG students belonging to SC/ST community and differently abled are exempted from the payment of tuition fee. All UG & PG Students belonging to differently abled are exempted from the payment of Special fee.

Fees once paid to the college will not be refunded on any account.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

1. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each period. No student shall absent himself from the classes without submitting the prescribed leave letter, countersigned by his/her parent or guardian or warden. Except in case of illness or other unforeseen cause, all applications for leave must be submitted in advance to the teacher-in-charge of the class. In case of illness, application for leave must be submitted as early as possible and not later than the first day the student attends the college after illness. If leave is asked for on grounds of sickness for more than three days the application must be supported by a medical certificate.
2. A student who absents himself/herself for one period loses half a day's attendance. Fines are levied for absence and additional penalties are levied for continued irregularity.
3. The period of leave sanctioned on the submission of leave application forms, will not be counted for the purpose of calculation of attendance earned by the student.
4. If a student is absent for ten days continuously without any proper leave letter, then his/her name will be removed from the rolls of the college.
5. The certificate of Attendance required for promotion and for admission to the summative examinations will not be granted unless (i) the student's progress and conduct have been satisfactory and (ii) the student has earned the necessary attendance.
6. If a student does not earn sufficient attendance to appear for the summative examinations, then his/her name will be removed from the rolls of the college.

MECHANISMS OF SEMESTER SYSTEM

A semester is a period of 90 working days. The College functions for 2 semesters in a year. The first semester begins generally in the 3rd week of June and ends in the last week of October and the second semester in the 1st week of December and ends in the 3rd week of April.

There shall be 30 hours of work per week.

A week consists of 6 working days. Day order system is followed.

The college functions from 9.30 am to 3.30 pm with 5 periods (3 in the forenoon session and 2 in the afternoon session) each with one hour duration. The time between 12.30 pm and 1.30 pm is treated as lunch interval.

ATTENDANCE NORMS FOR THE CANDIDATES APPEARING FOR THE SUMMATIVE EXAMINATIONS

1. Students who have obtained 75% and more attendance are eligible to appear for Summative Examinations without any pre-condition.
2. The Principal may condone the shortage of attendance of the student, who obtains attendance less than 75% and upto 65%. The condonation shall be done on the basis of merit and the recommendations of the Head of the Department concerned and the Dean - Student Services.
3. The students who obtain less than 65% of attendance shall be asked to repeat the semester.

Evaluation System

The performance of the students will be evaluated both by conducting Internal Assessment Tests during the course of the semester and Summative Examination at the end of the semester. The ratio between the external and Internal Assessment for theory papers shall be 75:25 for UG and 60:40 for PG Programmes. The pattern for internal assessment is as follows:

However, the ratio between the External and Internal Assessment for practicals shall be 60:40 for both UG and PG courses.

The students will be informed of their performance in the internal assessment tests by the way of displaying their marks in the College Website and sending SMS. The consolidated mark statement will be prepared by the Dean-Internal Examinations and the students are required to verify their marks.

There shall be an external practical examination for all the science subjects (Major & Ancillary) with one external and one / two internal examiners present for each subject. The internal examiner will be the teacher of our college who handles the subject. The external practical examination shall be conducted at the end of even semesters only.

Part V (NSS, NCC, YRC, RRC and Physical Education)

Evaluation system

Part V classes are conducted on every Tuesday and Thursday.

The performance of the students for part V classes will be assessed on the basis of

1. Attendance
2. Two assignments
3. Two internal examinations and
4. Special programmes

Retest Procedure for Internal Assessment

Retest will be conducted only by the Dean - Internal in a centralised manner and it will be conducted only for the following two categories of students:

1. Students who represent the college NSS/NCC/Sports/Inter-Collegiate competitions during the period of Internal Examinations.

Such students must inform the Dean - Student Services Cell and Dean-Internal well in advance through the permission letter duly signed by the teacher in-charge of the organisation/event and by the concerned Head of the Department.

2. Students who are absent on MEDICAL GROUND.

Such students must inform the Dean Student Services Cell and Dean-Internal through the permission letter duly signed by their respective Head of the Department. He/ She has to submit the medical certificate along with the permission letter.

Students who fail to score the required minimum marks in the internal assessment tests will not be allowed to take retest to improve their marks.

Passing Minimum - Under Graduate Programmes

For a pass in each theory and practical paper, a student should secure a minimum of 35% marks in the External Examination and a Minimum of 40% marks in aggregate (i.e. internal and external marks put together).

For a pass in the project, a student should secure a minimum of 35% marks in the Viva - Voce examination and a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate. (i.e. Project and Viva - Voce marks put together).

Passing Minimum - Post Graduate Programmes

For a pass in theory and practical paper, a student should secure a minimum of 45% marks in the External Examination and a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate (i.e., internal and external marks put together).

For a pass in the project, a student should secure a minimum of 45% marks in the viva-voce examination and a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate. (i.e., Project and Viva-voce marks put together).

Photocopy and Revaluation Procedures:

Revaluation option is given to both UG and PG students. The candidates should apply for photocopies of their answer scripts within 7 days after the publication of result and for revaluation within 15 days after the publication of results.

Rules for Supplementary Examinations:

In order to provide an opportunity for the final year UG and PG students to complete the programme in the same year without any loss of time, Supplementary Examinations are conducted.

1. The Supplementary examinations are conducted only for end semester examinations.
2. The supplementary examination will be conducted every year in the month of June and results shall be declared within seven days.
3. The weightage of this examination will remain same as the end semester examination.
4. A student can apply for a maximum of two courses in supplementary examination.
5. A separate grade sheet will be issued for these supplementary examinations.

ஒரு பாடத்தில் உள்மதிப்பீட்டுத் தேர்வு மதிப்பெண்ணைக் கணக்கிடும் போது அப்பாடத்தில் மாணவர் பெற்ற இரண்டு உள்மதிப்பீட்டுத் தேர்வின் சராசரியே கவனத்தில் கொள்ளப்படும். எனவே மாணவர்கள் இரண்டு உள்மதிப்பீட்டுத் தேர்வின்மீதும் தவறாது நல்லமுறையில் எழுதவேண்டுமெனவும். இரண்டு திட்டக் கட்டுரைகளையும் குறிப்பிட்ட காலத்திற்குள் சமர்ப்பிக்க வேண்டுமெனவும் அறிவுறுத்தப்படுகிறார்கள். உள்மதிப்பீட்டுத் தேர்வில் குறைந்த மதிப்பெண் பெறும் மாணவர்கள் புறமதிப்பீட்டுத் தேர்வில் தேர்ச்சி பெற்றாலும் அப்பாடத்தில் தேர்ச்சி பெற தேவையான 40 (UG) / 50 (PG) சதவிகிதம் மதிப்பெண் பெறமுடியாத காரணத்தினால் அப்பாடத்தில் தேர்ச்சி பெறமுடியாத நிலை ஏற்படும் எனத் தெரிவிக்கப்படுகிறார்கள்.

HALL TICKETS

1. Student shall receive the hall tickets, time tables and instructions for summative examinations from the college office two or three days before the commencement of the Examination.

**FEE CONCESSIONS
FEE CONCESSION 92 T.N.E.R.**

1. Students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (including converts) are eligible for award of full fee concession, if they produce a community certificate from Deputy Tahsildar.
2. U.G. students belonging to Denotified Communities and Most Backward Classes are also eligible for full fee concession sanctioned by the Backward Class Welfare Office, Virudhunagar District.
3. Students belonging to Backward Classes and converts from them are eligible for half fee concession if their parents' annual income does not exceed Rs. 50,000/-.

SCHOLARSHIPS**i. Backward Class Department:**

Residential and Non-Residential scholarship are sanctioned by the Backward Class Department to the students belonging to BC/ MBC/ DNC, if their parents' annual income does not exceed Rs. 2,00,000/-.

ii. Adi Dravida Welfare Department

Adi Dravida Welfare Scholarship is granted under Govt. of India and State Government Schemes. SC/ST students whose parents' annual income is below Rs.2,50,000/- are eligible for the above scholarships.

iii. Tamil Nadu Chief Minister's - Farmers Security Scheme

1. This scheme is applicable to the students who are studying in Aided and Self - finance Courses.
2. Identity card of Registered Membership under the scheme of Tamil Nadu Chief Minister's Farmers Security and a member of farmer's family is essential.
3. The students who receive any scholarship under Central or State Government Scheme are eligible for getting financial assistance under this scheme.

iv. Students Aid Fund:

Monetary help is given to the students who are not getting any other scholarship from Students Aid Fund on the basis of their merit, annual income of their parents and also in accordance with the rules of the committee constituted for the purpose.

NOTE:

Scholarship and Fee Concession holders should record 90% of attendance failing which the award will be withdrawn.

v. HOPE

Our College Management awards scholarships to highly deserving under graduate and post-graduate students under a new scheme HOPE (Helping Others Pursue Education). The prime objective of this scheme is to provide financial assistance to the meritorious students in curricular and extra-curricular activities to meet a part of their educational expenses.

For receiving the scholarship, the students should satisfy the following eligibility criteria:

1. The students who wish to receive the scholarship should be studying UG or PG at present in our college either in regular stream or in self-financing stream.
2. They should not have any history of arrear in their respective courses.
1. Students belonging to science programmes should have a minimum of 60%

in all the subjects till the previous semester and the students of humanities should possess not less than 55%.

2. They should maintain a minimum of 75% attendance in all the semesters.
3. No disciplinary action should have been taken against the student.

LIBRARY

- There is a Central Library in the college which is housed in a spacious magnificent building and it is very user friendly.
- Our library has a good collection of 1,07,154 books, 170 periodicals, 6100 back volumes, 4720 donated books, 3587 scheme books, theses, dissertations, question banks and educational CDs.
- Nearly 12,800 e-books have been uploaded for open access.
- The library has a separate back volume section for the referral needs of research scholars.
- Our library is fully automated and barcode technology is implemented for book circulation. OPAC facility is available in 14 systems for locating the books.
- One server with GSDL software with the storage capacity of 2GB RAM is available in the library for e-resource management. The server disseminates the stored e-resources to the departments through intranet.
- In-house resources like question banks, study materials and calendars are scanned and made available for access through intranet.
- Our college is a member of National Library Networks like DELNET, UGC-Infonet & AIRC for resource sharing.
- In addition, each postgraduate and undergraduate department maintains a separate department library with an excellent collection of text books, reference books and leading journals with back volumes.
- An E-GATE system is adapted for user entry.
- CCTV surveillance has been deployed.
- URKUND - anti plagiarism software has been installed for checking the sources.

General Rules

1. There is a library committee to monitor the overall functions of the library. The committee comprises of the Principal as President, the Librarian as Convenor, nine teaching staff and three students as members.
2. The library is under the direct control of the Librarian.
3. All the students, teaching and non-teaching staff of this college are entitled to use the library.
4. The library is kept open on all working days from 8.30 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. It remains closed on all Sundays and government holidays.
5. P.G. students are allowed to access the internet from 9.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. on all working days.
6. Internet information are given to UG students on submission of a requisition form available with the Librarian.

Rules applicable to students

1. Silence should be maintained strictly in the library and in the reading room.
2. Students must enter the library properly dressed.
3. Umbrellas, hand bags and other belongings should be left at the entrance itself.
4. Spitting and smoking are strictly prohibited.

5. Every undergraduate student shall be provided with two borrower's cards and postgraduate students with three cards.
6. They shall keep the cards carefully and return them to the Librarian after the completion of the course.
7. They shall be held responsible for all the books borrowed on their cards.
8. A student who has lost a borrower's card shall make a written request to the Librarian for the issue of a new card on payment of one rupee.
9. All the PG students and research scholars are allowed to enter the stack-room to select the books.
10. Open access system is followed in the Central Library.
11. Books will be issued from 9.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m on all working days.
12. Students on receiving books are expected to examine them and if any damage is found therein, they should bring it to the notice of the Librarian before leaving the library. Failure to do so will make them liable to any damage that may afterwards be detected.
13. Students shall not write upon, damage, or make any mark upon any book, periodical, manuscript or map belonging to the library.
14. No tracing or mechanical reproduction shall be made without getting prior permission from the Librarian.
15. Students shall be held responsible for any damage done to the books or other property belonging to the library and shall be required to replace such books or other property damaged or pay the value thereof along with fine which will be fixed by the Principal. Even if one book is damaged in a set of books, the whole set shall be replaced.
16. Students are not allowed to sub-lend books of the library to any person on any circumstances.
17. Students are not allowed to keep a book for more than fourteen days from the date of issue. At the end of the period, the books shall be returned to the library.
18. Books shall be returned to the Librarian or to the clerk at the counter before 9.30 a.m.
19. Books, falling due on holidays, may be returned on the next working day.
20. A student, failing to return a book after fourteen days from the date of issue, will have to pay one rupee as penalty for each day of delay for every book.
21. Penalty should be paid at the college cash counter.
22. Any book may be recalled by the librarian at any time without assigning any reason.
23. The Librarian is empowered to exclude a student at his/her discretion from the premises of the library who fails to return a book in time or fails to pay the penalty for misbehaviour in the library.

Book Bank Section

1. Poor and deserving students of undergraduate classes of the college are eligible to borrow books from book bank section, for class use. For this, they should apply for it through the Principal or the irrespective Head of the department.
2. A student may borrow two books at a time from this section and keep them for a semester. However students of B.A. branch XII (English and Tamil) may borrow six books in their subject.
3. All books borrowed from this section should be returned before the commencement of the Summative Examination, otherwise their caution

deposit will be forfeited.

Rules applicable to Teaching and Non-Teaching staff

1. Members of the staff of the college are entitled to borrow books from the library.
2. They have open access to the shelves.
3. They shall leave their personal copies of books, handbags etc., in the shelves provided for the purpose near the counter.
4. The maximum number of books issued on loan to each of the teaching staff is fifteen. The number of books issued on loan to each of the non-teaching staff is five.
5. They are allowed to keep a book, other than text book, for one month at the end of which period, it may be renewed on written request. Text books shall be returned at the end of the year.
6. Encyclopaedias, dictionaries and books, which are difficult to be replaced and books which are considered necessary for reference, shall not be lent out. However, they may be taken to class rooms by teacher during working hours by making entries in the register exclusively kept for them.
7. The back volumes of the journals are issued on loan to the teaching and non-teaching staff members. Each teaching staff is allowed to take five volumes of the journals and the non-teaching staff two.
8. The Librarian is empowered to recall a book at any time for the purpose of cataloguing or any other reasons.

RESEARCH FACILITIES

Research Departments of the college have well established research facilities. Active research is going on in all ten departments. To promote research activities, the college management is magnanimous enough to support financially the non-stipendary full-time Ph.D. research scholars with research fellowships. Two Ph.D. research fellowships are provided for each research department.

Internet facilities are made available to Ph.D. scholars. Various Minor/Major Research Projects are going on in many departments. Various steps have been taken

1. To have close contact with leading research institutes / centres in India and abroad by the college and Faculty to undertake need based R & D projects.
- 2) To identify industries in different thrust areas and to explore the possibility of new need based research projects.

GENERAL DISCIPLINE

1. Every student should be neatly dressed. The boys should wear only pants and shirts. They are prohibited from wearing T-shirts, short shirts, low hip jeans, and any dress with obscene words and pictures. Boys should not have long hairs or hairs with lightning cut. They are advised to come to college with their hairs neatly cut. Girl students should come either by wearing sarees or long churidhar with shawl. They should not wear Pants, T-shirts, leggings and short churidhars. Only first year girl students are allowed to come in half-sarees.
2. Punctuality should be strictly maintained by the students. They should be in their seats before the second bell rings. When the teacher enters the room, all students should rise and remain standing till they are asked to sit. No student should leave the class room without the permission of the teacher or until the class is dismissed.
3. Students are required to spend their leisure hours in the reading room. They

should not loiter in the verandahs and disturb other classes.

4. Students are prohibited from damaging or defacing college building, furniture, fittings and other properties. Damage done to the college property will be repaired at the cost of the student or students involved. Wilful damage is a serious offence.
5. Possessing lethal weapons, taking liquor, smoking cigarettes and firing crackers are considered as serious offences and such offences are punishable.
6. Stringent action will be taken against students who whistle, hoot or howl and disturb the normal functioning of the college. Similarly students who sit on the pitwalls and on the steps and make indecent comments will be punished.
7. Students should abstain from participating in party or communal politics. They are forbidden from participating in activities which tend to bring discredit to the college or impede its work.
8. Students should park their cycles and two wheelers only in the sheds allotted for the purpose. Students riding motor cycles within the premises of the college is strictly prohibited.
9. Girl students are advised to be in their common room when they do not have classes and during lunch hours.
10. Students should maintain respectable relationship with the teachers and with the non-teaching staff of the college.
11. Students should wear their identity card when they are in the college campus.
12. Students are prevented from using cell phones and walkman within the college premises.
13. Conversation between a boy and a girl is permissible only in the presence of a teacher.
14. Students are strictly informed that they should not participate either directly or be an accomplice in any kind of eve-teasing or ragging. If the students have any complaint of ragging on the campus, they shall immediately bring it to the notice of the Co-ordinator or any member of Anti-ragging committee. They shall also register the complaint either by calling the toll free number 1800-180-5522 available round the clock or e-mailing to helpline@antiragging.in.
15. Students should go on tour only with the permission of their respective Head of the Department and that too accompanied by a teacher nominated by him. On no account, the students should arrange tours by themselves in the name of the college.

The following may be the punishment to the students who violate the above said rules: The quantum of punishment shall naturally depend upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Student Discipline and Grievance Redressal Cell :

1. Recovery of the total cost of the damage. If more than one is involved, the cost may be recovered equally from all.
2. Expulsion from the college.
3. Suspension from attending classes.
4. Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process.
5. Suspension from the hostel.
6. Issue of conduct certificate without a good remark.

3. The Principal shall be the President of all these Associations and Societies.
 4. The Principal as President shall nominate the Head of the Department or any one from the teaching faculty at his discretion as the Vice-president of the respective Department Association / Society.
 5. The members of each Association / Society studying in the III year U.G. class / II Year P.G. class shall elect from themselves the Student Chairman of the concerned Association / Society.
 6. The members of each Association / Society studying in the II Year U.G. class

/ I Year P.G. class shall elect from themselves the student Secretary of concerned Association / Society.

7. I Year U.G. students shall elect from themselves the Joint-Secretary of their concerned Association.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ASSOCIATION / SOCIETY OFFICE BEARERS

The Students who contest for Chairman, Secretary or Joint Secretary of their Association / Society should fulfil the following criteria.

1. They should have earned 90% of attendance in their previous year of study.
2. They should not have arrear in any of their subjects.
3. They should have participated atleast in two extra-curricular activities either at school level or at the college level.
4. They should not have undergone any disciplinary action either inside the college or outside the college.

The office bearers of the Department Associations will function with an objective of promoting the academic and extra-curricular activities by conducting seminars, symposium and any other invited guest lectures. They should assist the Vice-President in carrying out co-curricular activities.

1. Genuine problems of the students should be brought to the notice of the Principal in writing. The Principal shall do the needful after hearing the grievances of the students.
2. If any student representative organizes mass cut of classes, he shall cease to hold the post to which he has been elected.
3. The student representatives shall be held responsible for all the property found in the class-rooms, laboratories and in their department premises. In case of loss or damage to college property in common areas, the department student representatives shall be held responsible for identifying the mischievous students.
4. If the attendance of the student representatives falls below 90% at any time during the semester, he shall cease to hold the post to which he has been elected.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The NCC is intended for the undergraduate classes. The College has 1/28 coy and the total strength is 100. NCC is offered as one of the Non-Major Elective Subjects to the UG students in their final year of study. But only the students who had been in NCC for two years are eligible to opt for this subject.

Aims of NCC

1. To develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship and the ideals of selfless service among the youth to make them useful citizens.
2. To create human resource of organised, trained and motivated youth to provide leadership in all walks of life including the Armed force and always be available for the service of the nation.
3. To create suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the Armed Forces.

Benefits to the students

1. Opportunity for personality development.
2. Award of scholarships to achieve academic excellence.
3. Monetary and other awards on excellence in NCC activities.
4. Benefits and reservation of seats in professional colleges.
5. Monetary and medical assistance to cover mishaps during training and

adventure and sports activities.

6. Opportunity to travel abroad when selected for Youth Exchange Programmes.
7. Easy terms to enter Armed Forces, Military Nursing Service and other Para Military Forces.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The NSS is intended for the students of I and II year undergraduate classes. The college has 7 units and the total strength is 700 (4 units for boys and 3 units for girls).

The students who complete 240 hours of regular work will get a certificate from NSS, Madurai Kamaraj University.

NSS regular work in the form of campus cleaning, services at adopted villages, awareness meetings etc. will be held on all Tuesdays and Thursdays between 3.30 pm and 5.30 pm.

OBJECTIVES OF NSS :

- i. To acquire leadership and democratic attitude.
- ii. To develop social and civic sense among students.
- iii. To gain skill in mobilising community participation.

YOUTH RED CROSS

The Youth Red Cross is yet another service organisation functioning in the college. It is the youth wing of international organisation, ICRC. It is a group movement involving students between 18 and 25 years of age in college.

The Youth Red Cross strives to inculcate in the youth an awareness especially the care of their own health and that of others, to understand and accept civic and human responsibilities, to maintain a spirit of service and to cultivate helping tendencies.

RED RIBBON CLUB

The main aim of this club is to create awareness among the college students on their health. It helps the students to develop their personality and leadership quality. It clarifies the doubts faced by the students in their adolescence.

From the academic year 2013-2014, RRC has been included as one of the Part V subjects. On all working Tuesdays and Thursdays between 4 pm and 6 pm regular classes / awareness meetings are conducted and campus cleaning works are done.

Seminars are arranged every month and the students are motivated to interact with the chief guests, usually doctors. Competitions are conducted to enrich the knowledge of the students.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Physical Education aims at developing skills, technique, co-operation, leadership, fitness, discipline, and physical, mental & moral standards of the students. Sports articles will be issued to the students both in the morning and in the evening on all working days. It is the responsibility of the student who takes the article to return it safely.

Coaching will be given to students in Sports and Games both in the morning and in the evening. Regular attendance to the coaching is a must for the participation in the Inter-Collegiate / Open Tournament.

During the coaching camp, health drinks will be provided to the students.

Training is given to students who are willing to join in army and in Police Department. Fee concession and mess concession are given to outstanding sports persons. They are also given priority in admission.

DISASTER MANAGEMENT

Disaster refers to the mishap, calamity or the grave occurrence from the nature or man - made reasons which can't be stopped or tackled immediately by the affected community. Disaster management has assumed great importance in recent times. To handle any unforeseen situation efficiently, we need to be well equipped with latest technologies. It is of utmost importance to be prepared with a proper disaster management team which can take charge as soon as possible when the disaster happens.

During natural calamity anywhere in India if it happens, students, teaching and non-teaching staff, NSS volunteers and NCC cadets with great involvement help the needy people by supplying clothes, food and stationaries in time. Fund will be also generated by receiving donations from willing donors and will be sent to the respective distributing government agencies directly in the affected areas.

INDOOR STADIUM

The Indoor Stadium, constructed at a cost of Rs. 1.24 crore, has international standard wooden floor courts with a gallery of seating capacity of 500. It houses 4 Badminton courts, one Basketball court and one Volleyball court. Facilities are also available to play indoor games like Table Tennis, Carom and Chess. The Indoor Stadium is lighted fully by LED bulbs to make it eco-friendly.

Modernised Multi Gym

The multi gym constructed at a cost of Rs. 10,00,000/- has high quality gym equipments with rubber sheet flooring. Facilities are available to practise weight lifting, power lifting, body building, general fitness and body weight management. Treadmill, Recumbent bike and Elliptical trainer are the star equipments. Wide mirrors are attached in the wall for motivation of the users.

TMB - EXTENSION COUNTER

An extension counter of Tamilnadu Mercantile Bank Ltd., is functioning in the college premises. Students and staff can avail themselves of the service of the extension counter of the bank.

VIRUDHUNAGAR HINDU NADARS' SENTHIKUMARA NADAR COLLEGE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Our college Old Boys Association was established on 13-9-1953. After the institution became a co-educational institution, it was re-christened as Virudhunagar Hindu Nadars' Senthikumara Nadar College Alumni Association (REG.No. SRG/VIRUDHUNAGAR/251/2019). The main objectives of the association are

College Magazine is the college's official annual publication. It aims to

provide record of an extensive range of activities in both curricular and co-curricular activities in one full year. An Editorial committee, composed of learned professors from various disciplines, is constituted every year to bring out the magazine. Students are motivated and encouraged to come up with innovative creations in writing jokes, riddles, stories, essays, poetry, articles in arts and science and drawings. The teachers also take equal interest in publishing the abstract of their research and project works in it. In addition, the magazine highlights the distinctions achieved by the students and teachers in various activities.

COLLEGE BOYS' HOSTEL

There are two hostels namely P.S.C. Hostel and M.S.P.S.S. Hostel functioning under the control of the chief warden. He is assisted by the Wardens and Residential Superintendents. Typewriting and shorthand classes are conducted in the hostel. To ensure hygienic food, cooking is done by steam. Audio system, Reading room, and TV are made available to the inmates for their enlightenment and recreation. Horizontal bar and parallel bar are made available to the inmates to keep them physically fit.

Application for admission to the hostel shall be made in the prescribed form. Admission is made on the merits of each application and no reason need to be assigned for refusing admission to any student.

Moreover the boys who are coming from 25 k.m. radius away from the college campus are advised to stay only in the college Hostel.

COLLEGE GIRLS' HOSTEL

A separate hostel functions for the girl students of the college.

Hostel Rules :

1. The parents of the hostelers will be informed well in advance of the other holidays except the stipulated monthly holidays.
2. The hostelers should report themselves to the hostel in stipulated time after the holidays, failing which, admission to the hostel will be denied.
3. Everytime when they leave the hostel and come back after holidays, they should sign the register maintained for it.
4. The hostelers should not directly send any message to their parents or anybody else through telephone or telegram. It should be conveyed only through the Warden.
5. They should get prior permission of their respective Head of the Department if they have to avail themselves of any leave from the hostel on working days.

Grievance APPEAL COMMITTEE FOR STUDENTS

The main objective of the Grievance Appeal Committee for Students is to solve the problems of the students then and there itself. If the students have any genuine problems, they are advised to approach the Committee and adopt the following procedures :

STUDENT TRAVEL CONCESSIONS

The Railways offer concession for bonafide students of Colleges to travel to their home town during vacations. Students intending to avail these concessions should get their forms signed by the Principal on or before the last working day of the semester.

FINE ARTS CLUB

The Principal shall be the President of the Club. He will nominate the convener and the co-ordinators to the club from the teaching staff, who are interested in Fine Arts. All the interested students can be the members of the club.

The Fine Arts Club helps to develop the oratorical and cultural talents among students. It also encourages the students to participate in the various cultural events at college and university levels.

The club has its own orchestra with all music instruments. The students who have talents and interest can take part in the college orchestra.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT CELL

Women Empowerment Cell helps to bring out and enhance the latent talents of the girl students by organizing programmes like career guidance, personality development, entrepreneurship training etc., It conducts competitions to expose the hidden talents in the girl students. Moreover, the Cell organizes programmes for the women in society and thus builds a rapport between the college and the society.

SENTHI HELPING WINGS CLUB

The objective of the Club is to create a comfortable environment on the campus for the differently abled students, particularly, the visually impaired. The services of the club include preparing audio study material for the visually challenged and arranging scribes for them during internal and external examinations.

PHOTOGRAPHIC CLUB

A Photographic Club is functioning under the supervision of a teacher to impart advanced training to the students in taking and printing photos so that they can become entrepreneurs. Club organises photography classes for the students. The course highlights the basic of light, parts of a DSLR camera, rules governing lighting, flash photography and photo editings.

COMPUTER FACILITY

Our college offers world class computing facility. The computational needs of the students, researchers and staff members are met through well-equipped laboratories. The resources in the Computer Lab are continually updated with the changing industrial trends. 700 computers are available in our college campus. Advanced computing facility is provided with the latest core i5 processors. There are four hi-tech computer labs consisting of Core i5 workstations to meet the requirement of regular laboratory sessions that are part of the academic curriculum. The lab includes Windows, Linux, Novell, Fedora computers, scanners, and printers. Each student is provided with an individual system and user account that can be used to access various computing services and resources. A special server room is assigned for networking facilities in each computer lab. A special server room is assigned for networking facilities in each computer lab. Each Computer Lab consists of high-end IBM servers, one of which caters to all the Windows-based workstations, one for UNIX based workstations and another one for Novell based workstations. The Computer Centres are provided with necessary infrastructure like sufficient air-conditioned space and stabilized uninterrupted power supply as well as trained technical staff. The Computer labs are kept open from morning 9 o' clock to evening 6 o' clock to enable the students to use them even after working hours.

Campus LAN

The Campus Network connects together 700 computers spread over the college campus. The Network utilizes a mixture of 802.11g wireless technology and coaxial cables and switches. There is also an intranet server with an internal Website which is considered as the backbone of the campus Network facility.

INTERNET ACCESS

All the Computer labs, offices, Departments and hostels are connected via 50 Mbps Leased Line and 7Mbps brand band internet at the 24/7 environment which provides unlimited Internet access to students and staff members. The college has Wi-Fi facility which provides internet facility to students and faculty members. E-Mail and Internet services are thus brought to the user's desktops.

HTEL

HTEL, Hub for Technology Enhanced Learning is a centre functioning exclusively to deliver the students with the video lectures offered by the premier institutes of India like Indian Institutes of Technology, Indian Institutes of Science and Indian Institutes of Management. HTEL repository includes 167 documentary videos, 145 explanatory videos and 113 lectures under diverse subject arenas of Commerce, English, History, Mathematics, Management, Life Science and Physical Science.

HTEL is recognised as the Local chapter of NPTEL - National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning - a joint initiative of IITs and IISC.

ANDROID APP "VHNSNC"

Our college Android App "VHNSNC 2.0" provides a great platform for our college students to get their Summative Examination results, internal marks, syllabus, previous year question papers, day order and important notification released from time to time.

The APP "VHNSNC" can be easily installed in any version of Android mobile phones from Google playstore.

With the UGC Grant and the fund provided by the College Management, our College Swimming Pool came into existence inside the campus. In India, only a very few Colleges have this facility and our College has got it for our students. Every year State level / National level swimming competitions are conducted for both school boys and college students. Girls are given separate timings. Coaches have been appointed to take care of the learners and students can make use of this rare opportunity to learn swimming and also to build their physique.

A spacious cycle stand is available for the benefits of the boys at the college entrance adjacent to south/est compound wall and for the girls at the Girls' common room and for the teaching and non-teaching staff in between Chemistry Block and Science Block Students are expected to park their vehicles only at the respective stands allotted to them.

9. கைகளைக் கழுவாமல் உங்களுடைய கண்கள், மூக்கு மற்றும் வாய்ப்பகுதியைத் தொடுவதைத் தவிர்த்திடுங்கள்.
10. முகக்கவசம் (மாஸ்க்) உபயோகித்த பின்னால், சுகாதார முறைப்படி சோப்பு போட்டு கழுவிய பின் நன்கு வெயிலில் காய வைத்த பின் மீண்டும் உபயோகிக்கலாம். சிதைந்த மற்றும் தரம் குறைந்த மாஸ்க்குகளை உடனடியாக கழித்துவிட வேண்டும். அவ்வாறு கழிக்கும் மாஸ்க்குகளை முறைப்படி குப்பைத் தொட்டியில் அப்புறப்படுத்த வேண்டும்.

- 4) வாரம் மூன்று முறை கபசுரக் குடிநீர் குடிக்கலாம்.
- 5) அனுதினமும் உடற்பயிற்சி, யோகா மற்றும் மூச்சுப்பயிற்சி முறையாக செய்ய வேண்டும்.
